Be Stedfast! by Faisal Clelland

In the first epistle to the Corinthians, written by the Apostle Paul through divine inspiration of God, was one of two letters written to this first century church. This letter consists of many subjects stemming from church conduct all the way to the resurrection of the dead. In the midst of all the teaching

of Paul, there is one verse that has echoed throughout the church age for thousands of years. 1 Corinthians 15:58 which simply states:

"Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for as much as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord". Scriptures like this one have sculpted the minds of many Christians to continue to serve the Lord during times of increasing adversity. In this passage I will show how 1 Corinthians 15:58 relates to our day and time.

What does it mean to be steadfast? Well, steadfast is an Old English term which means fixed. Webster's Collegiate Dictionary has steadfast, or now

spelled steadfast, as firmly fixed in place. Steadfast is also defined as not subject to change. When I think of it, I am amazed at the definition and how it relates to every believer as a shining characteristic of the nature of Christ which is in us operating in the will of God. Christ Jesus displayed steadfastness countless times while serving His Father in completing His will. Prime examples are the healing of diverse diseases well into the night (Mark 1:32-34), and enduring the shame and pain of a Roman crucifixion (Hebrews 12:2). No matter

where you might be as a Christian today, you can be steadfast God's plan for your life. How, you might ask? You can be steadfast and on course in the plan of God for your life by faith! It is by faith in the power of God working in our lives through His Son the Lord Jesus Christ that we overcome,

conquer, and remain steadfast, not subject to change.

The next word I want us to investigate is the word unmovable. It is made up of two words. Un is the first part and movable being the second. Movable, in the noun sense, is described as *something* that can be removed or displaced. In the case of 1 Corinthians 15:58, Apostle Paul wants us to be unmovable in the things of God. There are many times as Christians when we find ourselves in close fellowship and communion with God one week or month and the next week or month God's looking for us as He looked for Adam in the Garden? We must be unmovable in relationship with God even during our most difficult moments. Be encouraged! It's in those difficult moments that you can catch a clear glimpse of God at work in

your life. Amen! That means we must be unmovable in prayer, reading God's Word, fasting, and seeking His face. Now, we also must be unmovable in doctrine and not just in church services alone. A good example is the church at Galatia. They continued in church activities but were bewitched by false teachers when it came to fundamental doctrinal truths. The Apostle Paul had to come and upbraid the false doctrine and teach the doctrine again which he first taught the Galatians

we try with our mind. Astrophysicists and those of that ilk have concurred to a degree that the universe can have anywhere from 11 to 24 dimensions. That in itself is mind blowing. However, what is really mind blowing is this:

- The Bible states that the universe is too small to contain God. God must have more dimensions than man can imagine. He had to make the universe from the outside in and not the inside out.
- He is so multi-dimensional that He had to literally step down into flesh just so we could see Him.
- He walked on water, passed through walls, made Himself invisible as to pass through a murderous crowd, defied the laws of physics in ascending, spoke to the spirit realm, and was recognized when He told demons to be quiet. (Galatians 3:1). Let us keep in mind Eph. 4:14 which states "that we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive".

The last thing I would like us to investigate is "always abounding in the work of the Lord". Many people can say that they are connected or participate in some ministry or work for the Lord. But how many of us can say that we are abounding in that ministry or work? Abounding means to be present in large numbers or in great quantity. If we look at this definition supplied by Webster's Dictionary, we see that abounding carries the notion of visual results. Abounding in the work of the Lord means that results are present in the work that you're doing. Farmers abound in farming when crops appear after they are harvested in the correct season. If there aren't any crops appearing during the harvest season then how can the farmer say that he is abounding in

farming? If we are abounding in the work of the Lord, then we ought to be showing signs of growth, success, and great quantity. Now, I know that this is not an overnight process, so being steadfast and unmovable must now come into play. Even Jesus told a story about a master who went on a long journey and gave talents to his servants, upon the master's return the servants were to give an account of their actions with the talents that was given. Two out of the three servants abounded with the talents given to them and multiplied them. One servant did nothing with his talent and suffered loss (Luke 19:11-27). We must always be abounding in the work of the Lord especially with the day of His coming drawing nearer and nearer. Know that God loves you, know that you are accepted in Christ, and know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord!

Christians Worldwide to Unite in Prayer for One Day

Hundreds of millions of Christians around the world are expected to come together in prayer on Pentecost Sunday, May 31, for the annual Global Day of Prayer.

Individuals from 220 nations will gather in local churches, stadiums and other venues for the fifth annual event that crosses denominational lines and cultural barriers.

While participants are encouraged to pray for their own nation, event organizers also request prayers for issues such as the unreached people of the world, children who are at risk for various reasons, and the persecuted church, among other topics. Last year an estimated 500 million Christians participated in GDOP.

The massive global prayer event began as a local prayer event in Cape Town, South Africa in 2001. The event quickly expanded throughout Africa in subsequent years, and in 2005 Christians from 156 of the 220 nations of the world united in prayer.

Last year, 210 countries participated in the day of prayer, and this year all 220 countries are registered to hold some kind of prayer event. In addition to having Christians in every country participate in GDOP, this year will also be the first time a live webcast of the Pentecost Prayer Service from Jerusalem will be streamed online. IPrayTv.com hopes to connect Christians worldwide to the Holy Land on Pentecost with this effort. Viewers can watch the feed online at the group's web site for free. www.christianpost.com

Pastors: Hear God's Word: Tweet Later

"When you are in corporate worship, Worship!" says John Piper, a prominent evangelical pastor and author. "There is a difference between communion with God and *commenting* on communion with God."

Since its launch in 2006, Twitter has grown to 32 million users, including an active following of pastors and churchgoers. The microblogging service is touted as the fastest growing social networking site. Just a year ago, Twitter traffic was at 2 million.

Considering the popularity, especially among young adults and youths, some churches have embraced the technological and cultural phenomenon and incorporated it into their worship services.

An earlier *Time* magazine article cited, among other churches, Westwinds Community Church in Jackson, Mich., where worshippers' Tweets

during worship are flashed on large video screens.

But reports of Twittering in church have sparked a debate among pastors and Christians on whether it is appropriate. "While I personally enjoy Twitter and find it to be a useful tool for sharing and receiving information, I'm not excited about encouraging people to use Twitter during the Sunday meeting," Josh Harris, senior pastor of Covenant Life Church in Gaithersburg, Md., wrote in his blog.

One of the reasons why Harris won't be encouraging his congregation to Twitter during worship is that it will likely be distracting. Twitterers may be tempted to check their e-mail or read their Twitter feed during a sermon. Their mind may also focus on what to Tweet rather than on worship. Moreover, the minutes they take to Tweet would be minutes in which they weren't actively listening to the sermon.



"The most important thing I can do while I'm sitting under the preaching of God's word is to listen to what God is saying to me," Harris, who is also on the council of The Gospel Coalition, noted. "I need to actively engage my heart and mind to receive."

"When God is speaking again through his word, we should all be silent – and so should our Twitter feeds," he stressed.

He's not a Twitter hater, he wrote. He even encourages congregants to Tweet about the sermon or worship experience after church and sees it as a potential witnessing tool to friends who follow them on Twitter.

"But it's also a good witness for them to see that something so important, so essential, so holy happens on Sunday morning when God's church gathers that Twitter takes a back seat," the Gaithersburg pastor stated.

Backing Harris' points, evangelical pastor Piper of Bethlehem Baptist Church in Minneapolis, Minn., says churchgoers should focus only on hearing and engaging the Word of God. www.christianpost.com

Settlements Top Talk of Obama, Abbas Meeting

President Barack Obama welcomed Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas to the White House, Thursday. Israeli settlements topped the list of talking points between the two leaders. Obama and Abbas both want Israelis to stop

new settlement construction on disputed land in the West Bank, but Thursday the Israeli government said it will continue the construction. Abbas' visit follows last week's meetings with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu at the White House. Following these high profile meetings with Middle East leaders, the Obama administration says it will present detailed plans to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. On Wednesday, Secretary of State Hillary Clinton met with Egypt's foreign minister. Following the meeting, Clinton used some of the most direct and blunt language to date on the question of Israeli settlements. "With respect to settlements, the president was very clear when Prime Minister Netanyahu was here. He wants to see a stop to settlements. Not some settlements, not outposts, not natural growth exceptions," she said. "We think it is in the best interest of the effort that we are engaged in, that settlement expansion cease. That is our position."

"That is what we have communicated very clearly, not only to the Israelis but to the Palestinians and others and we intend to press that point," she added. Clinton's statement challenges the thousands of Jews who have chosen to live in the West Bank or what they believe is Israel's biblical inheritance, Judea and Samaria. "This is the Jewish state, and with all due respect to Mrs. Clinton, it is none of her business to tell Israel what to do with her settlements," said Hanna Failer, a settler living at Beit El. www.cbn.com

Abortion Doctor Gunned Down at Kansas Church

Dr. George Tiller, who remained one of the nation's few providers of late-term abortions despite decades of protests and attacks, was shot and killed Sunday in a church where he was serving as an usher. The gunman fled, but a 51-year-old suspect was arrested some 170 miles away in suburban Kansas City three hours after the shooting, Wichita Deputy Police Chief Tom Stolz said. Long a focus of national anti-

abortion groups, including a summer-long protest in 1991, Tiller was shot in the foyer of Reformation Lutheran Church, Stolz said. Tiller's attorney, Dan Monnat, said Tiller's wife, Jeanne, was in the choir at the time.

The suspect's name was not released; police had been looking for a gunman who fled in a car registered in the Kansas City suburb of Merriam. Stolz said all indications were that the man acted alone, although authorities were investigating whether he had any connection to anti-abortion groups. Stolz said the man was being brought back to Wichita, where he would likely be charged Monday with one count of murder and two of aggravated assault. Stolz said the gunman threatened two people who tried to stop him. The slaying of the 67-year-old doctor is "an unspeakable tragedy," his widow, four children and 10 grandchildren said in statement. "This is particularly heart-wrenching because George was shot down in his house of worship, a place of peace." The family said its loss "is also a loss for the city of Wichita and women across America. George dedicated his life to providing women with high-quality health care despite frequent threats and violence.

"Tiller's Women's Health Care Services clinic is one of just three in the nation where abortions are performed after the 21st week of pregnancy. The clinic was heavily fortified and Tiller often traveled with a bodyguard, but Stolz said there was no indication of security at the church Sunday. Planned Parenthood of Kansas and Mid-Missouri said it was working with law enforcement to secure its facilities Sunday even after the suspect was in custody. www.foxnews.com

Creation Museum Still Draws Crowds, Ruffles Feathers After 2 Years

The controversial Creation Museum in Petersburg, Ky., marked its second anniversary this past week with slightly lower numbers than its first year but with much excitement.

"We enter our third year excited about the growing opportunities the museum provides for reaching people with the creation gospel message," commented Ken Ham, the founder and president of the 70,000-square foot museum. "We believe God is using us to make a difference in our post-Christian culture, and we will

continue to do everything we can to help believers defend the Word of God, from the very first verse," he added.

When the museum first opened to the public on May 28, 2007, it drew a great deal of media exposure, largely because of its literal interpretation of the Bible. Packed with high-tech exhibits that include animatronic dinosaurs and a huge wooden ark, the \$27-million museum attempts to align the Bible's literal account of creation with natural history. The museum's staff and founder, like many other Young Earth creationists, believe dinosaurs appeared on the same day God created other land animals. Though Young Earth creationism is not unpopular, the Creation Museum has drawn protests from critics - both non-Christians and Christians who are against a literal interpretation of the Bible on life origins. They say they



are worried about how the anti-evolution display will affect children.

Young Earth creationism is the belief that the Heavens, Earth, and life on Earth were created by direct acts of God sometime between 6,000 and 10,000 years ago. Its adherents are mostly Christians and Jews who believe that God created the Earth and everything on it in six 24-hour days, taking the Hebrew text of Genesis as a literal account.

The belief starkly contrasts with evolutionary creationism and Old Earth creationism – an umbrella term for a number of types of creationism, including Gap creationism, Progressive creationism, and Intelligent design. Typically, Old Earth creationism is more compatible with mainstream scientific thought on the issues of geology, cosmology and the age of the Earth. www.christianpost.com

County Trying To Stop Home Bible Studies

A local pastor and his wife claim they were interrogated by a San Diego County official, who then threatened them with escalating fines if they continued to hold Bible studies in their home. Attorney Dean Broyles of The Western Center For Law & Policy was shocked with what happened to the pastor and his wife.

Broyles said, "The county asked, 'Do you have a regular meeting in your home?' She said, 'Yes.' 'Do you say amen?' 'Yes.' 'Do you pray?' 'Yes.' 'Do you say praise the Lord?' 'Yes.'"
The county employee notified the couple that the small Bible study, with an average of 15 people attending, was in violation of County regulations, according to Broyles.
Broyles said a few days later the couple received a written warning that listed "unlawful

ceived a written warning that listed "unlawful use of land" and told them to "stop religious assembly or apply for a major use permit" -- a process that could cost tens of thousands of dollars.

"For churches and religious assemblies there's big parking concerns, there's environmental impact concerns when you have hundreds or thousands of people gathering. But this is a different situation, and we believe that the application of the religious assembly principles to this Bible study is certainly misplaced," said Broyles.

Broyles said his clients have asked to stay anonymous until they give the county a demand letter that states by enforcing this regulation the county is violating their First Amendment right to freely exercise their religion.

Broyles also said this case has broader implications. "If the county thinks they can shut down groups of 10 or 15 Christians meeting in a home, what about people who meet regularly at home for poker night? What about people who meet for Tupperware parties? What about people who are meeting to watch baseball games on a regular basis and support the Chargers?" Broyles asked. www.10news.com

So, how much water do you need each day to keep your body -Shaniqua Leggett, RN. functioning properly? The Mayo Clinic (mayoclinic.com) recommends using the "8 x 8 rule" — drink eight 8-ounce glasses of water a day (about 1.9 liters). The rule could also be stated, "drink eight 8-ounce glasses of fluid a day," as all fluids count toward the daily total. Though the approach isn't supported by scientific evidence, many people use this basic rule as a guideline for how much water and other fluids to drink.
